- 49% of A level grades A*-A
- 80% of A level grades A*-B
- 34% of all BTEC grades Distinction* or Distinction
- Over 80% of students who applied to university progressed to their first choice establishment
- 79% of these places were Russell Group or 1994 Group universities
- Ten students secured places at Oxford and Cambridge.

High expectations & excellent support

A school sixth form not a college

- Hard work required
 - Detentions for noncompleted work
- Punctuality
 - It matters
 - Detentions for lateness
- Dress code
 - Suitable for a learning environment
 - Lanyards must be worn

- Attendance
 - Students cannot self-certify absences – parents or carers must do this
- Phone use
 - Only in designated areas
 - Confiscated if seen or heard in other areas
- Compulsory intervention classes if required

Study programme at KS5

- Students should choose three subjects
-and maybe an EPQ
- Those who achieve the very highest grades (8s and 9s) in most of their GCSEs may choose to do 4 A levels
- No AS levels....apart from Further Maths
- 2 hours of timetabled supervised study

Why?

- Advice from top universities
- 5 hours of lessons per subject
- Minimum of 5 hours of independent study (including homework) outside of lessons
- 3 A levels = 30 hours per week
- We would like our students to be doing more than just study for their A levels

EPQ – Extended project qualification

- Opportunity to undertake an independent piece of work of your choice
 - Extended essay
 - Film/documentary
 - Artwork/clothing
- Some universities offer lower grade requirements in you get an A in your EPQ
- Highly competitive universities, (including Oxford and Cambridge) recommend it

- How has the perception of Brutalist architecture changed from the 1970s to the present?
- To what extent is the transformation of Peckham, as a result of rapid gentrification, a positive impact on the community: a documentary report

- Some A levels keep your options open for longer choose 1 or 2 of these if you don't have a clue what you want to do




